Pity as I grew up, she was suffering from asthma. And at and and later at at a later stage depression. She even went to Falconberg Hospital. That was now in [unknown] In Cape Town, we thought she had a mental disorder and she was only admitted for two weeks. She was discharged. Her health, in any case, her health, deteriorated. Things went very bad wrong with it. Held after a very long. And suffering, she was admitted to for diabetic in one of our hospitals here in hospital. And her one leg was amputated.
